U.S. 3RD FLEET MISSION

U.S. 3rd Fleet is one of two tactical maneuvering arms for Commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet and is a combat-ready power in operational control of all naval forces throughout the West Coast of the United States and Hawaii. Our seagoing forces include four carrier strike groups and one expeditionary strike group, 100+ ships, and 68,000+ personnel, which support

the strike groups and other missions. Third Fleet also has a Maritime Expeditionary Security Group, a Seabee mobile construction group, an explosive ordnance disposal group, and air forces comprised of more than 400+ Navy aircraft, capable of flying the variety of missions required to support the maritime strategy.


